MORE THAN 30 MILES OF TRAILS!

The Trails at Tehaleh feature scenic natural areas and widely varied topography that make our community a great place to take a casual walk, observe wildlife, go mountain bike riding, or take an energizing hike or run. Wind through pines, rocks and wetlands, alpine meadows, and deep forest for endless outdoor adventure.

Trails connect homes to parks and parks to schools. Start off at The Post, where you'll find community information and the main Trail Head. From here, you can head to Yonder, a great park for bird watching and picnics. Or head north through Tehaleh Pass to Forest Park. Then, round the community and wind your way through the trees and up the plateau to Sticks 'n' Stones for great views of Mount Rainier.

HIGHEST MOUNTAIN IN THE CONTINENTAL U.S.**

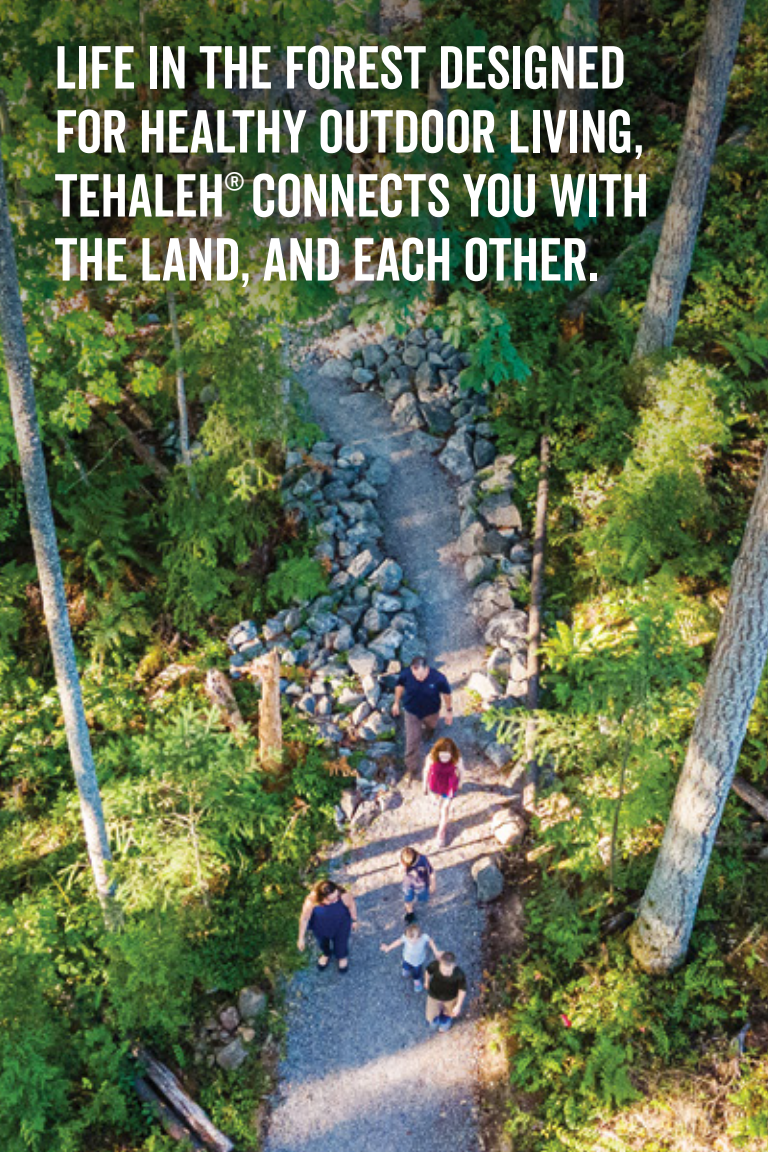
The area's largest attraction, Mount Rainier National Park, is situated southeast of Tehaleh, fewer than 25 miles away (as the crow flies). Outdoor activities include camping, hiking, biking, mountain climbing, snowshoeing, and sight-seeing. Learn about glaciers. Hike the Wonderland Trail. Prepare to have your breath taken away.

ANIMALS OF THE TEHALEH TRAILS



BALD EAGLE

A bird of prey that hunts along rivers and streams and builds a large nest called an aerie.



ELK

Herd of elk migrate from higher altitudes to the Carbon River in spring.



BROWN BAT

Hunts mosquitoes, moths, and other insects using sonar during the night.



DEER MOUSE

Nocturnal animal feeds on seeds, leaves, and fruits and builds nests in high hollow trees.



COOPER'S HAWK

A bird of prey that hunts primarily small birds in heavily vegetated areas.



BANANA SLUG

These decomposers digest leaves and forest debris, building rich forest soils.

- 1 FOREST PARK
Trails, trailhead, and a living room in the forest. Planned for 20 acres.
- 2 SPROUTS HOLLER
Playing field, playground, sports court, scooter park and sledding hill.
- 3 THE EDGE
Skate park, sports court, graffiti wall, meadow and seating.
- 4 YONDER
Pond, seating and wetlands.
- 5 BOLDER DASH
Playground, picnic spot, climbable boulders, and grassy domes.
- 6 KNOLL PARK
Seating and trails.
- 7 PONDER
Tranquil pond and seating.

- 8 STICKS 'N' STONES
Natural playground and picnic tables.
- 9 BIG SKY PARK
Zipline, bocce ball, dino dig and picnic pavilion.
- 10 HOUNDS HOLLOW
Fully fenced, off-leash dog park and pooch-friendly trails.
- 11 EXPEDITION GROVE
Tree fort, picnic, Discovery Trail.
- 12 DISCOVERY PARK
Gardens, outdoor amphitheater, expansive lawn area and trails.
- 13 REFLECTION PARK
Garden, paths and trails, bird watching and workout stations.
